Our goal is to continue creating the most exciting sport on Earth and we do so by managing all sporting, commercial and media aspects of the FIM MotoGP. World Championship (MotoGP), the pinnacle of motorcycle racing.

As a 360-degree organizer, Dorna Sports S.L. is conscious of the impact of its operations and MotoGP events on the environment and on communities all over the world, and is committed to taking action and proactively supporting initiatives to reduce MotoGP 's environmental footprint and to maximize the championship's positive impact on society and on the motorsport community.

The ESG strategy of Dorna Sports S.L., "Racing for the Future" represents the organizational commitment aimed at integrating ESG criteria into its activities. This strategy is structured around three fundamental pillars - Planet, Everyone, and Legacy - which guide our actions across sporting, event-related and organisational practices.

In order to pursue the short, medium, and long-term goals defined within its ESG strategy, to contribute to climate change mitigation, and to enhance our social and economic impact, Dorna Sports S.L. has decided to adopt an internationally recognized sustainability management system as organizer of the FIM MotoGP World Championship by obtaining the ISO 20121:2024 certification, the international standard for event sustainability management.

This decision leads to the implementation of the values promoted by the ISO 20121:2024 standard itself and by this policy, in reference to the document "4.5 Mission statement ISO 20121\_Dorna Sports", such as:

- Inclusion and accessibility,
- Integrity,
- Transparency,
- Participation
- Legacy.

The Sustainable Development Policy is fully integrated into the broader ESG strategy aiming at reinforcing the translation of *Racing for the Future's* pillars into actionable, measurable, and certified practices.

Each pillar drives concrete actions that not only reflect Dorna and MotoGP 's values and ambitions, but also contribute directly to broader ESG objectives, aligned with international standards and the United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

The Sustainable Development Policy is taking into consideration the following pillars:

1. **PLANET:** aimed at reducing our environmental footprint and boosting technological innovation to address global sustainability challenges.

The pillar encompasses initiatives that align with environmental commitments as follow:

- minimizing waste and promoting circular economy;
- measuring and decreasing CO2 emissions;

3. **LEGACY:** aimed at ensuring that sustainability is at the heart of the legacy, generating a positive impact beyond the races and guaranteeing awareness and education.

The pillar encompasses initiatives that align with governance commitments as follow:

- respecting international conventions and guidelines aimed at promoting a responsible business conduct and reinforcing respect of human and children's rights;
- guaranteeing compliance with current environmental, labor and health and safety regulations;
- managing MotoGP following the values mentioned above;
- influencing suppliers toward sustainable choices and behaviors;
- promoting continuous improvement by preparing an annual report containing the results and lessons learned and an improvement plan for the following year;
- engaging interested parties (employees, shareholders and investors, sponsors and partners, suppliers, circuits and promoters, teams and riders, manufacturers, international and national federations, media, volunteers, local public institutions, local authorities and spectators and guests) on the topic of environmental, social and economic sustainability, and consider their needs and expectations.

The actions mentioned above contribute to the following Sustainable Development Goals SDG 9: industry, innovation and infrastructure; SDG 12: responsible consumption and production; SDG 17: partnership for the goals.

The sustainable development policy of the Dorna Sports S.L. is implemented through an Action Plan which includes, as required by the ISO 20121 standard, a plan of Objectives and Actions and an ongoing monitoring system in order to limit environmental impact and enhance the social and economic impacts generated by FIM MotoGP" World Championship.
